## FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH



Happy Advent and Christmas! As I reflect on 2017, I thank God for bringing me through seasons of increase and decrease, of highs and lows. He's helped me grow to be more like Jesus., and I'm so thankful to see him work in so many lives here at FCC. God has been doing some amazing things here at First Christian! Numerous people have been increasing in their faith in Jesus, new servants have arisen in multiple ministries, new paid staff, volunteer staff and church leaders have arisen, and we've seen an increase in several new families attending and joining, along with their children and youth. God alone is to be praised! God wants us to be active in His Kingdom in Lawrence and I am so excited about what's in store for 2018!

Holiday seasons can be spectacular: all the meals, the lights, the friends and family, the presents, the worship, and gifts we can give others. Fun. Festive. Cozy. But, for many, even with all these delights, a

few *other* words come to mind. Dysfunctional. Toxic. Demoralizing. For copious people, spending time with their families can overshadow the joy of the season because of the profound, unhealthy, unchristian, relational patterns they experience. If you can relate to having anxiety around the holiday season because your families are toxic, here are some very quick tips on how to make it through this season with a bit more joy.

Make up your mind to act like a Christian. If you've given your life to Jesus, then commit to acting like Him. Don't pretend to be a constant victim to your emotions or bad behaviors. Instead, decide to let your devotion to Jesus rule you, not your anxiety, stress, or rage. Concur with Paul: "I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me" (Gal. 2:20 NET).

Get ready. It's coming. Unhealthy patterns can surface without us realizing it or even wanting it. Take the surprise factor away, and it will decrease your anxiety and fear when it occurs. Come to grips with the fact that the unhealthiness is *probably* coming when you get around that person (or people). Make decisions beforehand that will limit your anxiety, pain, or stress. For example, can you stay at a hotel instead? Can you eat in a different room? If it's too much for you to handle, strategically devise plans to minimize your exposure to the toxicity before it arrives.

If you didn't get enough of our dysfunctional family circus at Thanksgiving, we're inviting you to Christmas, too!

Figure out if there's anything that you do to increase the dysfunction. Own how, if at all, you contribute to the sick dance that takes place. Do you roll your eyes? Make inappropriate jokes? Exacerbate the problem? Bring up subjects just to spite them? Stop. Remember, that's not how Jesus related with people, no matter how unhealthy or evil they were. Be the Christian adult in the room.

You need to let go of the desire to fix or change them. People drive us "crazy" when we need something from them that they can't give. We expect them to behave differently, and when they don't, we're mad or hurt by them. Instead of responding maturely, we can then seek to control them by manipulative comments, giving the silent treatment, being passive aggressive, or being openly hostile. You absolutely must not do this. When you seek to control a person to get them to give you something they don't want to give or can't give, then—however counter-intuitive this sounds—that person has control over you. You are being ruled by their dysfunction. Let it go. Release that need. It's not in your job description. The holidays are not meant for your pet project of controlling or "fixing" your mom or dad or uncle or whomever. Let it go. You're not God. You're not a witch. Don't try to control.

Instead, get your healthy needs met by people who love and support you. When you have unconditional love, acceptance, and maturity from people who love you, you're not starving for it from other people. So, before the holidays, get your relationship nutrients from healthy sources. Moreover, *during* the holidays, garner needed support from healthy people (on call, if needed).

Focus on anything at all that is positive or likeable. This will help you have empathy. It's easy to "split" and only see the negative when someone has really hurt you or annoyed you. This makes it very difficult to empathize. Instead, focus on anything at all that you can which will help you let go of your negative feelings. Can you talk about a sports team you both like? A vacation? Jesus? Is there anything whatsoever which will change the subject to something tolerable?

**Take a break when you need to and pray.** Really: walk away, take a deep breath, and pray. Ask God to help you release the frustration, anxiety, or stress. Pray for the person (not *against* the person, but *for* the person). Ask God to help them be like Jesus. Of course, then keep praying the same for yourself.

We began 2017 with only a handful of children each week; now we have 30 children who are active in the ministry. This means that 30 children learn Bible stories each week. They take those stories home (with a little help from our Practice with Parents take-home sheet) and share their new knowledge with their families and friends.





At the beginning of 2017, I taught most FCC Kids classes since we had only a few volunteers in the ministry. Our volunteer base has doubled, and volunteer recruitment continues. This means that adults have the chance to grow in their discipleship as they prepare to teach lessons and that we have more adults willing to invest in our youngest disciples of Jesus. When 2017 began, there were only a few young families at FCC. As the year ends, there are nearly 20 young families who attend FCC regularly. This means that more children (and their parents) are growing in their faith each week. What a

blessing to watch God at work! As we end 2017, my prayer is that God's kingdom comes and that His will continues to be done in FCC Kids.



Our Youth and Children's Ministries are growing, the Giving Tree is thriving; we continue to support our missionaries, the Disciples and local outreach agencies. We continue to help feed the hungry through LINK, house the homeless through Family Promise and we help those families who find housing furnish their new homes through the Helping Hands Closet. We have a strong ministry and worship staff, DGroups are meeting and new ones will begin after the first of the year. We are hosting events to bring the Lawrence community to FCC in an attempt to share the love of Jesus and to invite them to come along side us as we all continue to grow in both our knowledge and love of Christ.

As it has been said many times, we are so thankful for the faithful support, the generous contributions and for the love that each one of you have for FCC. Without the gift of your time, talents, and resources, the ministry of FCC could not continue. Below we have provided the YTD totals for the Unified Budget at the end of October. We are showing YTD net income of \$8,209.00. At the end of October we should be at 83.33% of the budget, income is at 81.82% and expenses at 80.54%. The Unified Budget includes contribution income only, operating expenses and church support for Missions and Outreach.


